

Joint Pocklington / Sense / Wilberforce Trust conference confronts dual hearing and sight loss

New research reveals confusion and depression is not being dealt with.

Our newly published research reveals that almost 50% of people with combined deafness and sight loss were suffering high levels of psychological distress. At the same time, services meant to support them showed a lack of awareness of their needs and often failed to understand the implications of their sensory loss.
